8. Conditions for course completion

Course completion criteria

The third semester of the course is concluded with a written test covering the material discussed during the semester. The results of the test translate into a credit with a grade (zaliczenie z oceną).

Attendance is compulsory. To qualify for the final test, students are required to get at least 80% attendance of the total classes conducted in the semester. Should the student happen to exceed the number of allowed absences, some points will be deducted from their final test. If the total number of classes missed exceeds 50%, the course needs to be retaken. Students are required to come to the classes prepared and on time.

During the exam session students take an obligatory Practical Grammar Final Exam which covers the whole 3-semester programme. In

order to be able to participate in the Final Exam, the Student has to have received a positive semester grade (zaliczenie) first.
